



Back to Basics FAQs

• What is COC?

COC (Common Ownership Communities) is a division within the Prince George's County Office of Community Relations (OCR) that works with governing bodies, owners and residents of homeowners' associations, condominium associations and co-ops. Our goal is to secure resolutions to housing problems and ensure that residents are receiving the services and resources requested and due by law. COC works in tandem with the Commission on Common Ownership Communities (CCOC) to ensure streamlined decision making and problem solving.

What is the role of the Commission (CCOC)?

The Prince George's County Commission on Common Ownership Communities was established and is regulated by County law to ensure that COCs provide assistance to constituents living within the County. The Commission is made up of 13 Commissioners from various entities and backgrounds. The Commission also collaborates with COC on training, programming and public hearings.

What topics will be discussed?

Back to Basics will focus on the rudimentary elements of living in a common ownership community. Such topics as Understanding Governing Documents, Roles and Responsibilities of the Homeowner, and Legislative Overview will be addressed.

Who will be in attendance?

Community members, management companies, OCR staff, and CCOC commissioners will be in attendance. Special guest County Executive Angela Alsobrooks will address attendees.
