7b. Exception Request to Allow Removal of Four Pine Trees at 8F Plateau Place

In July 2015, Technical Services staff received a permit request for installation of a patio in the garden side yard of 8F Plateau Place. The work involves removal of four existing pine trees Staff referred this issue to the Architectural Review Committee and after review ARC recommended 5-0 that the Board of Directors grant an exception by allowing the members at 8F Plateau Place to remove the four pine trees.

Motion:The Board of Directors does authorize the removal of four pine treesin the gardenside yard of 8F Plateau Place to facilitate the installation of abrick patio by the members of the unit and stipulates that GHI's treemaintenance contractor shall remove the trees at the members' expense.Moved: MarcavitchSeconded: JamesCarried 8-0

7c. <u>Maintenance Agreement for Trimming/Mowing City of Greenbelt Playgrounds</u>

The City of Greenbelt signed a 3-year agreement with GHI in 2005 to mow and trim 12 City playgrounds. The agreement was renewed in 2008, and 2011. The three-year agreement signed in Minutes, GHI Board of Directors-August 20, 2015

2011 ended in December 2014. GHI's charges for this service from 2008 to 2014 were as follows:

At the end of 2014, GHI entered into a new contract with the contractor who provides mowing and trimming services to the City playgrounds as well as all GHI common areas. The contractor increased its charges by 2% to a \$41,416.08 for 2015 with no increase in 2016.

Staff contacted the City Manager who stated that the City would be amenable to a new agreement for mowing the 12 City playgrounds in 2015 and 2016 at a cost of \$5815 per annum. The proposed charge of \$5815 reflects a 2% increase in 2015, over the 2014 charge of \$5,700 with no further increase in 2016.

Staff recommends that GHI enter into a two-year agreement with the City of Greenbelt to mow and trim twelve City playgrounds at a cost of \$5,815 per annum during 2015 and 2016.

Motion: The Board of Directors authorizes the Manager to enter into an agreement with the City of Greenbelt, whereby GHI would provide services to mow and trim twelve City playgrounds during 2015 and 2016, and charge the City of Greenbelt \$5815 per annum to provide such services.

those arrangements, and a report would be given at the September 3 meeting.
