Living in GHI provides many benefits to residents, but learning who to call when you need something can sometimes be a bit overwhelming, especially when added in to the chaos of moving into a new home. GHI staff is here to help! Below is a list of GHI's departments, their phone number extensions (after dialing 301-474-4161), and a few of the things their department can help members with:

MEMBER SERVICES (extension 140)

- Receives all visitors and directs them to the appropriate person when visiting or calling the office
- Handles member complaints (e.g., noise, pets, parking, neighbor issues)
- Coordinates where committees meet; maintains committee records
- Garage, parking space and boat/RV lot assignments
- GHI sublease permits
- Parkway rental apartments

FINANCE DEPARTMENT (extension 136)

- All matters related to co-op payments and taxes
- Questions about insurance; providing master policy info to lenders
- Purchase/sales contract processing and settlements
- GHI & GDC budget

MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT (extension 127, or call 301-474-6011 for emergencies)

- Maintenance requests for work on homes
- Fee-for-Service requests
- Common areas and woodlands maintenance
- Warehouse supplies available to members (e.g. grass seed, trim paint, loaner tools)

TECHNICAL SERVICES (extension 143)

- Permits for any modifications to GHI units, e.g. additions, decks, etc.
- Mold issues
- Home inspections
- Questions regarding work being done on or near your unit (e.g. gutters, sidewalks, parking lot)

HOMES IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (extension 160)

• All things related to the HIP program

MANAGEMENT OFFICE (extension 148)

- Complaints which have not been resolved by other departments' Directors
- Newsletter production and communications
- Coordinates GHI volunteers
