Kitchen Magic: Making the Most of Your Renovation

Today's kitchens are often called the heart of the home—cherished open spaces where many activities take place. Perhaps that's why, though GHI kitchens may be small, there is no shortage of imagination at work among our members in making them beautiful, functional, and efficient spaces even on a budget.

on the new GHI **YouTube** channel. Be sure to take a look if a kitchen renovation is in your future!

Just as each cook and each family is unique, so too are the needs for each kitchen. No two GHI kitchens are exactly alike, so each project has its own challenges. Designing a space that meets your needs also means designing the process for how it gets done. Doing this effectively helps ensure that your kitchen turns out to be what you envisioned. The process varies greatly depending on your budget, access to technical expertise

and timeframe, but here are some basic tips from contest winners that anyone planning a GHI kitchen renovation should keep in mind.

- 1. Have good communication with GHI's Technical Services Department. Whether you are doing the work yourself or hiring a contractor, permit and inspection requirements must be met. Always be sure everyone is on the same page.
- 2. If you hire a contractor, use one familiar with GHI, try to get at least 3 bids, be sure to get references and look at some of their previous work.
- 3. Ask friends, neighbors and others you may know to see their actual kitchens for ideas.
- 4. Do your research, take photos, and have lots of patience. Everything takes longer than you think.
- 5. Build "wiggle room" in your budget (at least 10%) for unanticipated expenses.

Professional designer Kelly Hoppen writes on the HuffPost lifestyle blog to consider aesthetics as well as functionality in the design. Careful planning is essential so that the most used room in the house is also where you want to spend most of your time. Lighting is especially important, as is making the space welcoming and relaxing. Although open kitchens remain the trend, some designers still prefer the privacy of galley kitchens, which also keep kitchen messes out of sight. The choice is yours.
